Two DVDs about Logging in Michigan's Upper Peninsula



A Century of Logging Stories

This DVD consists of six exclusive interviews of loggers who were active during the logging of virgin timber. These are their best stories and their greatest memories. For example, the story of a bride who had never cooked before, yet became the camp cook. And hear about the failed attempt to unionize the loggers in the 1950s.

These loggers vary in age from 78 to 98 years old.

The DVD is filled with historical pictures matching the logger's stories. The photos range from the 1920s to 1958. Watch one interview or all six for a total of 137 minutes.

How Logging Has Changed in the Last 150 years

This DVD is 42 minutes long and contains demonstrations of how logging tools were used, including still pictures (from private collections) of a Shay locomotive and vintage tractors.

Other features include vintage footage of a river drive in the 1920s, logging footage of the 1960s, and an interview of an old logger.
